### Minutes of the August 7, 2014, meeting of the South Carolina Board of Health and Environmental Control

Vice-Chairman Lutz called the meeting to order and stated notice of this meeting had been provided to all persons, organizations and news media, which have requested notification, as required by Section 30-4-80(e) of the South Carolina Code of Laws.

### Item 1: Minutes of July 10 meeting (Attachment 1-1)

Dr. Kirol moved, seconded by Mr. Batts, to approve the minutes as submitted for the July 10 meeting. The Board voted and Motion carried.

## <u>Item 2: Administrative and Consent Orders issued by Environmental Affairs</u> (Attachment 2-1)

Ms. Robin Stephens, Assistant to the Deputy Director, EQC, stated seven (7) Administrative Orders and forty-five (45) Consent Orders had been issued with total penalties of \$209,775.

The Board accepted this item as information.

## <u>Item 3: Administrative Orders, Consent Orders and Sanction Letters issued by Health Regulation (Attachment 3-1)</u>

Ms. Melinda Bradshaw, Health Regulation Liaison, stated one (1) Administrative Order, four (4) Consent Orders, and one (1) Emergency Suspension Order had been issued with total penalties of \$22,500.

The Board accepted this item as information.

# Item 4: Public Hearing and Request for Final Approval – Proposed Repeal of Regulation 61-72, Procedures for Contested Cases, State Register Document No. 4466, Legislative Review is Required (Attachment 4-1)

Mr. Rupi Grewal, Assistant General Counsel, presented this item to the Board.

The Department proposes the attached Notice of Proposed Regulation repealing R.61-72, Procedures for Contested Cases for submission for General Assembly review. Legal authority for this repeal resides in 1976 Code Sections 1-23-500, 1-23-600, 44-1-50, and 44-1-60. Adjudicatory hearings as prescribed in R.61-72 no longer occur due to the statutory creation of the Administrative Law Court ("ALC") and 1976 Code Section 44-1-60 providing for ALC review of final agency decisions. The requirements and procedures of R.61-72 have no legal effect. As such, the Department proposes this repeal.

A public hearing was conducted; however, no one in attendance spoke. (Attachment 4-2)

After discussion, Mr. Batts moved, seconded by Mr. Hewitt, to find for the need and reasonableness of the Proposed Repeal of Regulation 61-72, Procedures for Contested Cases, and approve it for submission to the Legislature for review. The Board voted and Motion carried.

A verbatim transcript of this proceeding is included as part of the permanent record. (Attachment 4-3)

### <u>Item 5: Proposed Amendment of Regulation 61-91, Standards for Licensing Ambulatory</u> Surgical Facilities, Legislative Review is required (Attachment 5-1)

Ms. Gwen Thompson, Bureau Chief, Bureau of Health Facilities Regulation, presented this item to the Board.

Statutory authority for Regulation 61-91, Standards for Licensing Ambulatory Surgical Facilities can be found in 1976 Code Sections 44-7-260. The Department substantively amended the regulation on June 27, 2003. The purpose of the regulation is to provide a set of standards for facilities defined as a distinct, freestanding, self-contained entity that is organized, administered, equipped, and operated exclusively for the purpose of performing surgical procedures or related care, treatment, procedures and/or services, for which patients are scheduled to arrive and be discharged the same day. The proposed amendments herein include the efforts of the Department's Bureau of Health Facilities Licensing to incorporate current construction requirements and overall improvements to the text of the regulation. The Department recommends revision to ensure compliance with current construction requirements.

After discussion, Mr. Hewitt moved, seconded by Mr. Batts, to grant approval to publish a Notice of Proposed Amendment of Regulation 61-91, Standards for Licensing Ambulatory Surgical Facilities, in the State Register, to provide opportunity for public comment, to receive and consider comments, and allow staff to proceed with a public hearing before the Board. The Board voted and Motion carried.

### **Item 8: Agency Affairs**

Director Templeton asked for an Executive Session for the purpose of obtaining legal advice related to the Pinewood Site and the Barnwell/Chem Nuclear Site matters under the attorney-client privilege

### **Item 11: Legal Report**

No report.

Mr. Joye moved, seconded by Mr. Batts, to go into Executive Session for the purpose of obtaining legal advice related to the Pinewood Site and the Barnwell/Chem Nuclear Site matters under the attorney-client privilege. The Board voted and Motion carried.

Vice-Chairman Lutz announced that the meeting would adjourn immediately after the Board returned from Executive Session.

Vice Chairman Lutz announced the Board was back in public session and while in Executive Session, no actions were taken.

The Meeting adjourned.
